Scissor Skills And Their Importance Cutting with scissors is an important fine motor exercise, as it strengthens the fingersthat are needed to control the pencil, and also helps develop stabilityon the ulnar side of the hand (the little finger side of the hand). This can help children with other fine motor skills, including handwriting.
