The practice of guided reading is based on the belief that the optimal learning for a reader occurs when they are assisted by an educator, or expert 'other', to read and understand a text with clear but limited guidance. Guided reading allows students to practise and consolidate effective reading strategies.

As children move through the 5 reading stages they need to learn, practice and master multiple reading strategies. This includes using. prior knowledge; predicting; visualising; questioning; comprehension; drawing inferences; summarising; synthesising; and knowing when to use each strategy. Reading is not just about identifying a word, it is about so much more.

Guided reading is a technique which is often used to help students become better independent readers. It involves the teacher working with small groups of students with a similar reading level and supporting them in their skills development. However, guided reading can also be done as a whole-class activity, providing students with support whilst allowing time for independent work to be done at their own pace.

An introduction to guided reading for primary classes

Guided reading explained. Children will be divided into ability groups, according to their reading levels. The teacher will choose a set of books for the group she or he is reading with, that is appropriate to their level. Generally, teachers need to think about two things when carrying out a guided reading session: decoding and comprehension.

Guided reading is one component of the shared reading block during which the teacher provides support for small, flexible groups of beginning readers. The teacher helps students learn to use reading strategies, such as context clues, letter and sound knowledge, and syntax or word structure, as they read a text or book that is unfamiliar to them.
