Expressing Your Results – Research Methods in Psychology

In research report there are usually six sub-sections: (1) Abstract: This is always written last because it is a very brief summary: Include a one sentence summary, giving the topic to be studied. This may include the hypothesis and some brief theoretical background research, for example the name of the researchers whose work you have replicated.

A research report explains the investigation and results of asingleresearch question (or small set of highly-related questions). Researchreports are published in a format we are very familiar with, the IMRD,that plays nicely with an idealized version of the scientific method(see figure below). The term "research report" is moreaccuratethan the term "article" which refers to any major publication (reviews,reports, editorials, guidelines, etc) found in any journal,peer-reviewed ...

Writing in Psychology Research Reports

Self-report data is gathered typically from paper-and-pencil or electronic format, or sometimes through an interview. 1. Self-reports are commonly used in psychological studies because they can yield much valuable and diagnostic information to a researcher or a clinician.

The Use of Self-Report Data in Psychology

The reporting standards for research synthesis and meta-analyses are self-contained in Table 9. In essence, Table 1 covers the basic features for reporting all forms of quantitative empirical studies. It is organized around the usual structure of a journal article found in the behavioral and psychological sciences literature.
